



For Janelle, the experience was inspiring and



## **Ingredients**

- 1 lb ground meat (beef or chicken)
- 1/2 lb Italian sausage (optional)
- 1 large block of Velveeta cheese, diced
- 1 can RoTel tomatoes
- 1 packet of taco seasoning

- 1 large Vidalia or sweet onion, diced
- 1-2 fresh jalapenos, finely diced
- 1 can condensed mushroom soup
- Salt, pepper, garlic powder, red pepper to taste

### Instructions

- 1. Brown ground meat with diced onions and jalapenos and taco seasoning. Drain.
- 2. Add ground meat and veggies, diced Velveeta cheese, Rotel tomatoes to crock pot (crock pot on high).
- 3. Mix all ingredients and allow the cheese to melt thoroughly in crock pot.
- Please note that the cheese tends to burn quicker once melted and you may have to put the crock pot on low.

### **Tips & Notes**

Serve with tortilla chips, vegetables, or pretzels. For a spicier dip, leave the seeds in the jalapenos. You can also add a can of diced green chilies for extra flavor. Enjoy!

#### 2026 Top Ten Business Women of ABWA Recognition

The Top Ten Business Women of the American Business Women's Association was created in 1953 to underscore women's professional accomplishments, contributions to their community, and engagement in ABWA.

The nominee's application must be submitted by mail to ABWA National no later than May 15, 2025. A panel of independent judges (non-ABWA members) will review and rank the nominee applications on a score from 1-10 (ten being the highest level or the "best" score). An additional 5 points may be added to any nominee's cumulative score provided she meets/exceeds the Optional Criteria (listed below).

#### Eligibility Requirements for Members

#### To be considered for this prestigious award, the nominee must:

- Be a National Member (with or without a League affiliation) in good standing for at least two consecutive years as of May 15, 2025.
- Be employed full-time.
- Be able to demonstrate career advancement (increase in job scope) in the past five years.
- Have served as a volunteer in a community organization that is non-sectarian/non-partisan since May 15, 2022.
- Have successfully completed four Apex Courses since May 15, 2023. Note: Four certificates of completion must be submitted with the nominee's application.
- Be registered for and in attendance at the 2025 National Women's Leadership Conference by August 1, 2025.
- Sponsored at least one new member since May 15, 2024.
- A League must be chartered and in good standing for a minimum of one year with the American Business Women's Association by May 15, 2025.



Each Top Ten Business Woman, Class of 2026 is eligible for ABWA's most prestigious honor bestowed on an individual member, provided she:

 Participates in the panel interview on date/time scheduled.

#### Optional Criteria

## The nominee may qualify for additional points towards the award, if she has:

- · Earned a minimum of a baccalaureate degree.
- Attended at least one ABWA Nationally sponsored conference events (virtual or in-person) since May 15, 2022.
- Sponsored more than three ABWA members since May 15, 2022.
- Has supported the formation/chartering of an ABWA Chapter or Express Network since 2020.
- Served on the National Board of Directors, as a league officer/committee chair, or as a volunteer for the NWLC team since 2020.

We want you to enjoy this prestigious honor to the fullest thus, a member who is serving on the National Board of Directors will not qualify to participate in this award while she is still in office.
